

For those in search of history, stunning Furness Abbey, 14th century Piel Castle and a maritime heritage are all waiting to be explored. Barrow's large, award winning Dock Museum brings the town's industrial past to life beautifully with models, displays and exhibitions.

Nature Reserves on North and South Walney & Sandscale Hawes are internationally renowned and are the setting for spectacular displays of wildlife and fauna including a seal colony, the largest colony of herring gulls in Europe and rarities such as the Natterjack toad and the Walney Geranium.
