5. Please provide details of why you consider the Major Modification is not legally compliant or is unsound. Green spaces are an intrinsic part of the borough's Green Infrastructure. The Trust therefore supports in principle the identification of an additional area of green space at Walker Street/James Street, Askham in Furness. However the Trust remains concerned that the Council's approach to the definition of Green Infrastructure (i.e. the policy framework underpinning Policy GI4) remains flawed. Specifically, it does not does not fully recognise the full range of GI benefits provided by the wider rural area - including water courses and bodies, and public rights of way linkages. The Trust's property at Sandscale Haws is a good example of this type of GI asset. The National Trust has raised concerns at earlier stages in the preparation of the Local Plan in this regard, notably submitted in respect of the Preferred Options consultation, dated 4th September 2015 and the Pre Submission Draft consultation, dated 4th July 2017. Detailed comments were also submitted in relation to the supporting Green Infrastructure Strategy (in draft format at this time). It is noted that the Final Draft GI Strategy (July 2016) retains the previous approach, as does the Submission Draft Local Plan. In the National Trust's view therefore, the Local Plan fails the tests of legal compliance and soundness in respect of Green Infrastructure, since it does not fully reflect the NPPF's definition: Green infrastructure: A network of multi-functional green space, urban and rural, which is capable of delivering a wide range of environmental and quality of life benefits for local communities.
