In December 2017, a subsidiary of Centrica Plc, GB Gas Holdings Limited and SWM Gasbeteilligungs GmbH & Co. KG ("SWM"), the majority shareholder of Bayerngas GmbH, combined their European E&P activities and created a new joint venture company, Spirit Energy's landholding at Barrow comprises the North and South Morecambe Terminals, the Condensate Tank Farm and onshore buried pipelines, whilst Centrica plc retain the former Roosecote Power Station. Spirit Energy and Centrica plc should be engaged separately with respect to their properties.

Centrica plc submitted representations to the Regulation 19 draft of the Local Plan on 7 July 2017. We remind the Council that these representations supported recognition given to onshore energy assets and Policy EC7 Energy Uses Opportunity Area (EUOA), however they also requested an amendment to the boundary of the EUOA designation and amendments to the text of Policy EC7.

Spirit Energy welcomes the changes which have already been made to the boundary designation of the EUOA. However, the full extent of Spirit Energy's landholding around the North and South Morecambe Gas Terminals has not been identified within the amended designation boundary. We request all of the land shown on the attached plan is included within the EUOA designation.

Changes were also requested to the text of Policy EC7 to better reflect existing and future activities at the site, which appear to have been accepted by BBC in the 'reason' for changing the EUOA designation, however were not made to the policy text. We request the text of Policy EC7 is amended (as set out in earlier representations and below) to acknowledge the importance of the existing energy operations on the site, as well as identifying the development potential for future exploration, production, generation and transmission of energy and related activities.

The amendments requested are justified, having regard to NPPF Paragraphs 7, 19 and 21, which seek to enable sustainable growth, create flexible policy frameworks for future development and supports existing businesses. We consider the Plan (with the requested amendments) would meet the "tests of soundness" set out at NPPF Paragraph 182, for the following reasons:

- Positively prepared the Plan has taken into account the development and potential infrastructure requirements, having positively responding to the ongoing needs of existing businesses
- Consistent with national policy the Plan would be consistent with the NPPF, which states that planning should operate to encourage and not act as an impediment to sustainable growth (paragraph 19) and that significant weight should be placed on the need to support economic growth through the planning system and policies should be flexible enough to accommodate needs not anticipated in the plan and to allow a rapid response to changes in economic circumstances. Investment in business should not be over-burdened by the combined requirements of planning policy expectations and local authorities should support existing business sectors, taking account of whether they are expanding or contracting (Paragraph 21).
