Please find below my comments regarding this permit application:

Any treatment or storage prior to fuelling burner would come under EA regulation, the applicant would have to be aware that a WM3 assessment will be required to prove the waste wood is suitable for the purpose- The operator has an Environmental Permit which includes (in Schedule A1) physical treatment (associated with storage and treatment prior to fuelling the biomass boiler) including manual and mechanical sorting/ separation, screening, shredding, bailing, crushing, compaction or drying of non-hazardous waste. (attached for reference).

This permit also covers limit of drying activity in Schedule 1: 'Physical treatment including manual and mechanical sorting/ separation, screening, shredding, bailing, crushing, compaction or drying of non-hazardous waste.'

The applicant would have to be aware that assessment under Waste Management paper 3 will be required to prove the waste wood is suitable for the purpose (ie fuelling a Part b biomass boiler).

Some info. below from a 'draft' guidance document which should support LA Part B applications

For the avoidance of doubt, any waste wood which has been classified as hazardous waste or any waste wood originating from construction and demolition works cannot be incinerated / combusted in a 5.1 Part B appliance.
